+Mass Bookings

If it is your intention to attend Mass, booking is essential. Please book by email: **barry@rcadc.org** or by telephoning the parish office: **01446 735051** (option 2), please state which Mass you wish to attend and how many people are attending. **The parish office will be open Tuesday to Friday from 9.00am to 2.00pm to receive bookings for Saturday/Sunday Mass, either by email or telephone. This means that the office is closed, for Mass bookings, from 2.00pm Friday to 9.00am Tuesday. If you have been unable to book a place for Mass please do not turn up on the off chance that there may be a place available as it is important that the guidelines are adhered to, which could lead to disappointment.** The church doors will be open 20 minutes before Mass begins and will be locked as soon as Mass begins. Please follow the stewards instructions as a seating plan & one way system are in place. Please ensure you only sit in the seat that the steward has designated you to. Face Covering is mandatory unless medically exempt.

+Entering & Exiting The Church

Please note that the new way in which we enter and exit the church for Mass is now in operation.

Weekends: Please enter the Church using the Parish Hall doors and exit through the same doors.

Weekdays: Please enter the Church using the Parish Hall doors and exit via the car park gate.

This will enable us to socially distance inside the porch while signing in for Mass. The reason that we have changed this procedure is to ensure that in bad weather throughout winter parishioners are not waiting outside the building.

As always the stewards will be on hand to guide you.

+World Day Of The Poor 2020

Today (Sunday 15th November) marks the fourth World Day Of The Poor, On this day we are invited to offer friendship, solidarity and welcome to the poorest of our sisters and brothers.

In the Pope’s message for the fourth World Day of the Poor, Pope Francis writes that ‘keeping our gaze fixed on the poor is difficult’, but that it is ‘more necessary than ever if we are to give proper direction to our personal life and the life of society.’ He draws on the Book of Sirach as a guide for reflection and action following the pandemic. ‘Now is a good time to recover the conviction that we need one another, that we have a shared responsibility for others and the world’, he says. ‘Until we revive our sense of responsibility for our neighbour and for every person, grave economic, financial and political crises will continue.’

The bishops of England and Wales have shared their hope that parishes would consider fresh opportunities for older people to experience more of the care and belonging that they want, and that we would hope to see for ourselves and our loved ones. Pope Francis, too, has called on everyone to embrace positively the reality of ageing, and to counter the ‘throwaway culture’ which leaves many older people socially isolated. This theme has even more significance following the Covid-19 pandemic.
