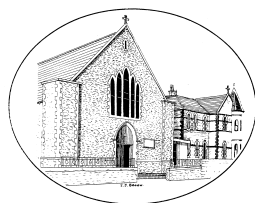

+Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity 18th – 25th January

The theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in
2022 was selected by the Middle East Council of
Churches and originates from the churches in Lebanon.
Present times in Lebanon are extremely difficult and
economically disastrous. All this combined with the
effects of the COVID-19 pandemic have made the
situation quite stressful. The power of prayer in
solidarity with those who suffer is a demonstration of
Christian unity and a sign of communion.

The theme, taken from the second chapter of the
Gospel according to Matthew, is the Epiphany.

Each year in January, the Church recalls the visit of the
Magi to Bethlehem, highlighting God's invitation to all
of humanity to a new covenant in the Incarnation of
Christ. In the Eastern Churches, Epiphany is joined to
the mystery of the Baptism of Christ, a baptism all
Christians hold in common as testimony to their faith in
the Son of God.

+Synod 2021-23

to consider two questions each week which we will
discuss at the meeting, the first two of ten questions
that we will be considering as part of our contribution
to Synod 2021 -2023 are:

1. The Journeying Companions-

When we say "our church" who is part of it?

2. Listening-

How are the voices of minorities, the discarded and
excluded listened to in our Church?

+Peace Sunday

Peace Sunday follows the international World Day of
Peace and is celebrated in the parishes of England and
Wales on the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time. In 2022
this falls on 16 January. The theme is taken from Pope
Francis' message for the 55th World Day of Peace:
Dialogue between Generations, Education, Work and
Dialogue: Tools for Building Lasting Peace.

Pax Christi, the international Catholic movement for
peace, takes the lead in providing resources for Peace
Sunday. Its National President, Archbishop Malcolm
McMahon of Liverpool, says:

"This year has been one of unprecedented and
continuing challenges. We are all conscious of the need
to restore and rebuild our communities here and
around the world, accepting that we need new ways of
working and relating to each other.

"The Christian message of peace, through
reconciliation, justice and nonviolence, can offer hope
and direction in these times."
