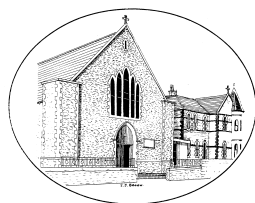

+Fr Pat’s Retirement Celebrations

As announced some weeks ago Fr Pat will be retiring and celebrating his last Mass as Parish Priest on Sunday 24th July at 10:30am.

Following Mass there will be refreshments in the Parish Hall. The hall will be open for parishioners from 12 noon until 4:00pm. Parishioners are invited to attend for some of that time, this will allow others to attend without the hall becoming over occupied.

There is no need to book, please just turn up on the day. At all Masses on the weekend’s of 10th and 17th July there will be a collection for Fr Pat which will be presented to him at the celebration.

There will be a celebration for Fr Pat’s retirement on Friday 7th October. The celebration will begin with Mass at St Helen’s at 5:00pm, the Mass will be open to everyone. Following Mass there will be a reception at Cottrell Park Golf Club, this will include a 2 Course meal. The price of this per person is £20.00 and does not include transport. If you wish to attend the reception at Cottrell park, spaces are still available please take a form from the back of the church and return it as soon as possible.

The closing date for this is Sunday 10th July.

+Ss Peter & Paul

On June 29 the Church celebrates the feast day of Sts Peter & Paul, **this is a Holy Day Of Obligation.**

As early as the year 258, there is evidence of an already lengthy tradition of celebrating the solemnities of both Saint Peter and Saint Paul on the same day. Together, the two saints are the founders of the See of Rome, through their preaching, ministry and martyrdom there. Peter, who was named Simon, was a fisherman of Galilee and was introduced to the Lord Jesus by his brother Andrew, also a fisherman. Jesus gave him the name Cephas (Petrus in Latin), which means ‘Rock,’ because he was to become the rock upon which Christ would build His Church.

St. Paul was the Apostle of the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church.

In a sermon in the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Sts. Peter and Paul: “Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles’ blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labors, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith.” **There will be a retiring Collection for Peter’s Pence at all Masses next weekend 3rd July.**
